Requirements for Covert Operations

- Protection Buildings or Sites (Illegal Entry/Theft/Damage)
- Prevention of Fly Tipping
- Anti-Social Behaviour (Graffiti)
- Enforcement of Railway Bylaws and Regulations
- Theft or Damage (Railway Stock, Communications)



There are numerous reasons for National Railways to conduct Covert Operations in the course of their work, with the Prevention of Criminal Activity being a priority in reducing theft which costs millions of vital funds and the provision of Public Health and Safety which could lead Enforcement on those responsible for breaches of Environmental impacts.

To be proficient, agents and employees of the Environment Agency require essential covert operational training and development, that develops the relevant theory and practical skills which will allow them to build a portfolio of evidence.
